Purpose:

The purpose of the Faculty Development subcommittee is to:

- o Collaborate with the Program for Faculty Development regarding learning modules, train-the-trainer workshops, on-line resources, etc., for faculty.
- o Develop communication strategies regarding CBME.
- Recommend and advise regarding policy changes as it relates to faculty and competency based medical education.

Completing EPA observations and coaching residents to competence is a critical element of programmatic assessment in CBME/CBD. This hands-on workshop is intended for faculty development leads, faculty/staff/senior residents that complete EPA observations in the clinical learning environment. A detailed review of the intent and practicalities of completing EPA observations including using the EPA forms, O-scale, coaching the resident 'in the moment' focused on their learning goals, and providing relevant, actionable feedback efficiently will be covered.
