<u>CBME Retreat 2022</u> was focused on evaluation and quality improvement. Informed by keynote on programmatic assessment in CBD (Dr. Nancy Dudek, U. Ottawa) and national, institutional data, as well as, the results of our local resident experience survey, participants worked to understand the urgent problems relating to implementation, assessment and resident burden. Through collaborative working groups and large group discussion by

broad representation of all key roles in CBME, including residents, multiple quality improvement strategies were identified to address and inform CBME committee planning and program level implementation. Strategies were disseminated and discussed on a follow up CBME Open Forum.

Completing EPA observations and coaching residents to competence is a critical element of programmatic assessment in CBME/CBD. This hands-on workshop is intended for faculty development leads, faculty/staff/senior residents that complete EPA observations in the clinical learning environment. A detailed review of the intent and practicalities of completing EPA observations including using the EPA forms, O-scale, coaching the resident 'in the moment' focused on their learning goals, and providing relevant, actionable feedback efficiently will be covered. In CBD, coaching over Time describes an important relationship between an Academic Coach (Advisor) and a learner. The coach guides the learner as they progress through the CBD stages of training. In this workshop, participants will have the opportunity to build on basic foundations of Academic Coaching principles and further explore this coaching relationship, principles of motivational interviewing, and how to support learners across the various stages of their learning journey. Using the framework of motivational interviewing, participants will explore coaching skills in more challenging situations in small groups.
