## **Royal College Update: Next steps for CBD Adaptations**

- The Royal College final approved CBD adaptations proposal was received in June 2024. See
  attached What is CBD 2.0? communique just released from the RC to get up to date. It aligns
  with our CBME CQI workplan and our intention to support programs through this adaptation
  phase. Also attached is a presentation you may modify to communicate with your program;
- The RC is working to operationalize these adaptations over time as described in the document and communications will continue to keep invested groups informed;
- Speciality committees will play an active role and many programs are currently into EPA
  versioning will may result in a reduced number of EPAs, changes to contextual variables, flexible
  observation numbers;
- It may be worth reviewing the <u>Statement on Enhanced Flexibility for CBD Program Implementation</u> issued by the College in April, 2023 and the <u>Essential Requirements of CBD Implementation</u>. There are some good reminders of the flexibility programs have such as the ability to determine how many entrusted EPA observations are required for each EPA; the recommended number was simply a recommendation. This may lend to reduced burden as does refining your system of assessment with complementary WBAs, ITERS, Sim, OSCE's, Mini-CEX and any other methods/tools that capture resident performance holistically and efficiently. See <u>Curriculum and Assessment mapping</u> resources and 4 user-friendly maps. The RC Technical Guides further identify areas of flexibility and accreditation considerations;

## **PG CBME Activities**

 We will continue to move forward with implementing our <u>CQI strategies</u> across the 5 priority areas in alignment with CBD adaptations. With input and engagement across program leaders, faculty, and residents our CBME committees will focus on:

- Reducing faculty and resident burden (supporting versioning of EPAs to reduce and refine assessment requirements, enhance efficiencies, work to reduce expiries and improve completion rates, improve quality narrative and its assessment, ease of tracking progress and access to data (exports, data visualization option, learner orientation and improved feedback from Competence Committees, identify and address other barriers that are discipline/program specific;
